1 Samuel 30:1-8. David Inquired of the Lord.

David and his men had returned from battle to find their home of Ziklag destroyed and their wives and children captured. David's two wives were also taken and the people talked of stoning him. Yet before pursuing the enemy and going to rescue their families, David took the time to inquire of the Lord. He didn't act out of despair or fear. He sought the Lord. May we do the same, and seek Your will, and obey what You speak to us, and not act out of despair, fear, or vengeance.


